

If medication is to be administered at school please follow instructions below:

- **Medications must be in the original labeled container (no baggies, foil, etc)**
- **Pharmacists will usually provide a duplicate labeled container for the school doses**
- **Permission forms must be completed for each medication given**
- **Parent/Guardian must provide specific instructions along with the medication and any related equipment to the clinic personnel (such as nebulizer machines, Diabetic glucose monitors, etc.)**
- **It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to inform the school of any changes. New medication or new doses will not be given unless a new permission form is completed and a newly labeled container is provided. This includes oral and injectable Diabetic med. (Insulin, Glucophage, etc.)**
- **Any unused medication will be disposed of if not picked up by the last day of school. This includes inhalers, epi-pens, etc.**
- **Medications should be age specific (for elementary school students) unless a physicians' note accompanies it stating that the student is allowed to have the medicine. (For example: elementary school age children should have Children's Motrin or Children's Tylenol because it states the child's age/weight and dose. Most adult Ibuprofen labels state to consult a physician for child under 12 years of age.)**
